Peregrine Fitzhugh, and his brother, Captain William Fitzhugh, who came to the Genesee Country in 1806. Secluded in the depths of the forest on the Sill farm, Peregrine Fitzhugh's faithful retainers wait Gabriel's trump. A kind master, they were warmly sheltered in their chill northern home, and each grave was marked by a red cedar post." "In the old burial place at the Point two colored people were buried. She was born in Rock Bridge county, Virginia, and was born a slave, and was one up to the time of the civil war, when she was set free. She came to Huron in the year 1864, and had lived there, or in the vicinity, during the remainder of her life. The cause of death was old age. She was about 100 years old. She was well liked in the vicinity where she lived. She often amused those of the younger generation with tales of slavery days. Her funeral was held at the home of William Scott on Sunday, the Rev. J. R. Guthrie officiating. The service was largely attended. She was buried in the Huron cemetery."</p>
